(Tekstualne mreže ranonovovjekovne Hrvatske / Textual Networks of Early Modern Croatia)

a digital scholarly edition of two Nicholas of Modruš's orations designed as an information system

inspirations: Scholastic Commentaries and Texts Archive (SCTA) and Homer Multitext

make explicit as much of editorial knowledge as possible

constraints: not space, but organization annotate features of a text

textual structure (division in chapters, paragraphs, sentences, words)

morphology, syntax, lemmata

lectiones variantes (variant readings)

named entities (persons, places, things)

knowledge in the areas of mythology and realia

echoes of other texts

multiple (TEI XML) versions of the same text

citation framework: CITE architecture / CTS (Neel Smith, Christopher Blackwell)

connect the edited text with available digital facsimiles using IIIF manifests

in a digital scholarly edition, everything should be citable in a stable and structured way

validation TEI: ODD / schema CTS: Hook test version control Git integrated withZenodo DOI: 10.5281/zenodo.820829

the edition is not yet complete (it does not have an attractive interface yet)

the goal is to demonstrate the concept, encourage our colleagues editors (TeMrežaH project and beyond) to explore the potential of digital scholarly editions

for us, its main advantage is that of making a lot of knowledge explicit
